The role of the Catalan painter Claudio Castelucho and The Académie de la Grande Chaumière in the professionalization of American Art Nouveau women artists.

Abstract in English of your presentation (maximum 1,000 characters, in Arial 12 font)

At the turn of the twentieth century Paris had become the "cultural capital" of the world. During this period, American women artists came in large numbers to train at various académies and in the studios of the great artists. The École des Beaux-Arts did not allow women to enter its doors until 1897. Therefore the académies offered women artists the opportunity to train in an academic environment typically reserved for men.

L'Académie de La Grande Chaumière co-directed by Martha Stettler and Alice Dannenberg refused to teach the strict academic rules of painting of the École des Beaux-Arts and it opened the way to the "Art Indépendant" also for women.

In addition, many independent artists' studios, like the Catalan painter Claudio Castelucho professor in La Grande Chaumière, who had taken on American pupils. It seeks to examine the relationships between Castelucho and the American women painters and which lessons they ultimately brought back to the United States. This theme leads us to reflect on the role of Castelucho in the professionalization of American women artists

Her research interests are modern and contemporary figurative painting, with a special focus on the international contacts and influences over Catalonia and France, Catalan artists exhibitions in Paris, the American women painters under Claudio Castelucho as well as, ModernCatalan painters in the United States in the 1920s and 1930s of the 20th century through the travelling exhibitions. Her most recent publications include Luces y sombras del arte español en la Exposición Universal de París de 1900, 2014 and Exposición de
