Hospital and School or Fortress and Temple – Jewish community buildings by Béla Lajta in Budapest

Abstract in English of your presentation (maximum 1,000 characters)

Between 1905-1914 major architectural realisations of the Budapest neolog (reform) Jewish community (School for the Blind, Charity Home, Grammar School) were all designed by Béla Lajta, a key personality of local art nouveau. Historical literature has interpreted these buildings solely in the context of conflicting stylistic trends of period Hungarian architecture. It should not be overlooked, however, that these monumental, ornate constructions with emphatic Jewish character constituted a drastic break with the community's long tradition of building well-planned and well-equipped but architecturally indistinctive welfare and educational buildings. By analyzing their reception by the community press and by reinserting the buildings in the context of contemporary cultural and political debates this paper attempts to analyse how these architecturally innovative buildings were envisaged and interpreted by various groups of Jewish leaders and intellectuals to convey differing redefinitions of Hungarian-Jewish identity at the end of the liberal era.
